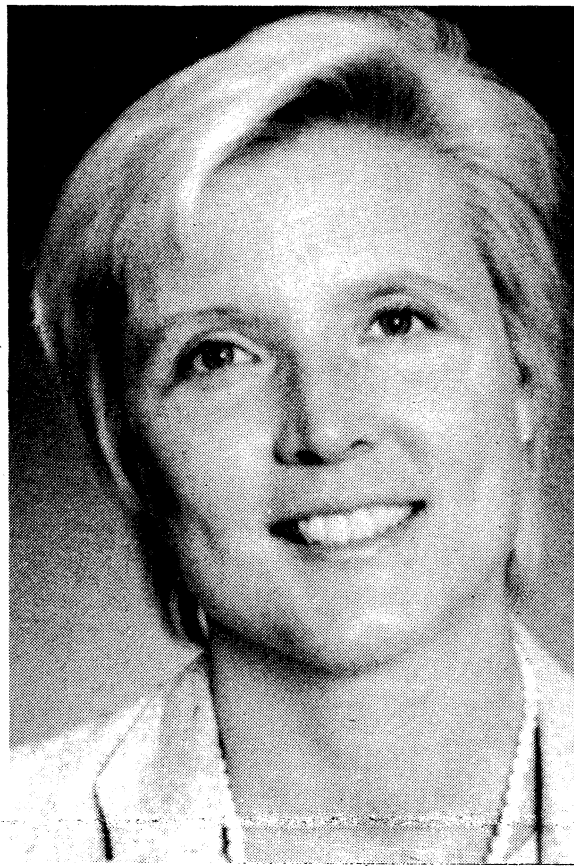

SECURITY

I thought I would take this opportunity to welcome returning students and extend a special welcome to newcomers to Glendon College on behalf of the Security Department. At the same time, I want to give you a brief overview of the department and what it does here on campus.

We operate 24 hours a day, seven days a week, all year long. Our aim is to ensure that the campus is a safe and secure environment for all the students, faculty, staff and visitors to Glendon College.

Eight full-time security officers are assigned to the Glendon campus. We work in teams of two and are divided into four squads. We do foot patrols of the campus and the buildings. Also, we are prepared to respond to any emergency calls that are

received from anywhere on campus. You will see us all over the campus, day and night; we will be walking, driving or cycling about the college grounds.

The department has also trained several officers in a program called PACT, which stands for "Pro Active Cycle Team".

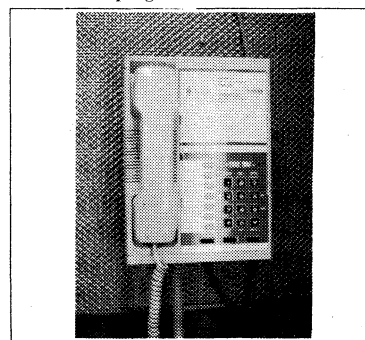
The officers using the bikes can get to the scene of an accident or other emergency anywhere on campus where it would be impractical to use a car. Even the officers using the bikes are equipped with cellular phones and radios, thus they can be reached very easily by dialing the numbers listed at the end of the article.

In addition to regular security, the University operated a service called Student Security. They provide an escort service on campus from 6pm until 2am every

night during the regular academic year. In the summer, the service operates from 8pm until 2am.

Usually, there are 6 students working each shift. There is a supervisor, two teams of two students each and a base operator or dispatcher. In the usual scheme of things, the students alternate foot patrols and motorized patrols all over the campus. Some members of this team have been trained to use the cycles, so don't be surprised if you see them ...

BOOKSTORE QUESTION

ADDRESSED

Finally, one of the most frequent complaints of Glendon students is being addressed - the inadequate service of the bookstore. A group of francophone and anglophone professors, staff, the Business Manager Leon Wasser, Principal Roseann Runte, two students and representatives from the York-Keele campus met at the Principal's residence at 7:00pm on Wednesday September 9 for the first meeting on the problem of the bookstore.

The group was addressed by John Hedgecock, executive director of York Bookstores. Hedgecock presented his philosophical visions for a new store and discussed the academic responsibilities of the store to Glendon. However, the members of the Glendon

community quickly directed Hedgecock to more pertinent issues. Those issues are simply that the merchandise is too expensive and that the store does not stock a large enough variety of stationery supplies.

Patrik Marier, the Vice-President of the Glendon College Student Union, shared that students can purchase the same dictionaries and stationery supplies at other Toronto stores for much lower prices and that in fact the Student Union takes its business elsewhere. Mr. Marier explained that students are not interested in a beautiful store, but rather one that sells mandatory course materials at the lowest prices possible. In fact, Hedgecock informed the brainstorming group that book wholesalers charge the same prices for books. See page 3

Hospitality Glendon: Summer Update

A wide variety of conferences, tours, weddings and other special events take place at Glendon between May and August. Hospitality Glendon is responsible for organizing and booking about 250 events throughout the year, but is especially active during the summer, when the rooms in Hillard Residence are used to accomodate guests.

According to Leon Wasser, Business Manager, this summer was Hospitality Glendon's busiest ever.

Highlights of this summer included the 5th Canadian Conference of Women in Engineering, Science and Techology, which involved the discussion of educational and job opportunities for women in science related fields.

The Hugh MacMillan Centre and the Canadian National Institute for the Blind

sponsored programmes for physically and visually challenged students. These students spent several weeks on campus learning skills to help them cope with university and residence life.

Many student groups from all over Canada held events here during the summer. For instance, three hundred students from the Universite de Sherbrook participated in an English exchange programme at Glendon.

The campus also served as the location for the filming of a Toyota commercial and an episode of the T.V. series "Missing Treasures."

Other events included the "Canadian Conference of Gender, Race and Class Equality," a meeting of the American Society of Primatologists and a Linguistics conference. Although it is only September, many events have already been

booked for next summer.

Approximately twenty students were employed by Hospitality Glendon on a regular basis during the summer. Ten more students were hired to assist during peak times. Students jobs were also indirectly created in areas such as security and catering.

Most revenue generated by Hospitality Glendon goes toward upkeep of the residences, as well as toward student's salaries.

GLENDON PULSE

In twenty-seven years, Glendon has become a community of students coming from everywhere to share the intellectual and social changes. Multiculturalism, bilingualism, the quality of the education provided, the services offered and social activites are all essential points which influence the students' lives. Does Glendon succeed to serve students interests? After graduation, do the students retain positive or negative impressions of Glendon? This survey, by taking Glendon's pulse, will answer these question.

Envoyé aux 284 diplômés de 1991-1992, le sondage de 13 questions fait le point sur la satisfaction générale des étudiants. Grâce aux 105 réponses écrites, qui représentent un taux de 37%, il est donc possible de mettre le doigt sur les points forts et les points faibles de glendon. De plus, il est à espérer que ce sondage ne dormira pas dans les fonds de tiroirs des personnes concernées ou alors dans les poubelles de recyclage. Car les étudiants on le droit à ce qui est le meilleur, puisque sans eux, de toute façon, Glendon n'existerait pas.

According to the survey, most students are satisfied with their stay at Glendon College. One student commented that, "coming from another university as a transfer student, I am greatly impressed with Glendon". The responses reveal that 51% of the students have "very good" and 29% "good" opinions of their profs. For another alumnus, "Glendon profs are excellent and deserve more recognition". These are, in general, the most positive answers, but they are by no means universal.

Allons-y avec les Services aux Etudiants: 64% des étudiants se disent satisfaits contre 36% sont insatisfaits. Il y a donc matière à une petite amélioration. Ces deux commentaires représentent les principales plaintes retrouvées dans plusieurs réponses, en anglais: "The staff in C105 could have a better attitude", "No two people in C105 gave out the same information". Les réponses à la question 9, quant à la satisfaction de l'administration du collège, ont frappé fort. L'administration du collège a coulé le test avec un 48%. Un étudiant a écrit: "too big business, no concern for the students, just with money." Une administration démistifié, crédible et plus proche des étudiants aurait une meilleure opinion de ceux-ci.

Ensuite, la Cafétéria. Eh bien il semble que d'années en années, on paye toujours plus cher, et quoi qu'on en dise, rien ne bouge. Enfin, le journal Pro Tem, même s'il a 84% de réponses positive, a tout de même reçu un message négatif: "Le journal représente le collège en général, mais difficilement as population". L'étudiant ne se sent donc pas assez bien représenté, ce qui veut dire qu'il y a aussi de l'amélioration à faire au sein du journal étudiant.

This survey showed that Glendon College is very good, but can still be improved. It will be interesting to look at another survey, in a couple of years, to see how Glendon will be preparing itself and its students for not only a new century, but a new millennium.

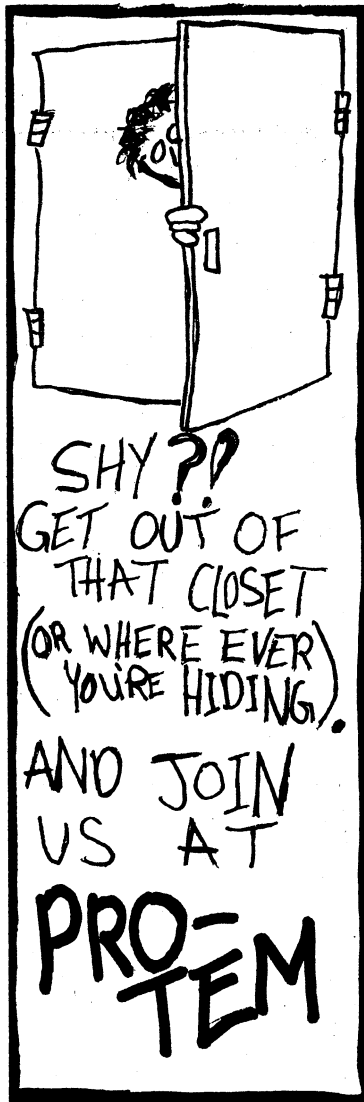

SUMMER HIGHLIGHTS

Some of the highlights of the activities, accomplishments and happenings at Glendon over the summer include the following:

Le nombre d'étudiant(e)s a augmenté de 8%

The Voice Response system was inaugurated and we have all worked hard at smoothing out the introductory-transition phase.

Le bureau de liaison a reçu une bourse, dans le cadre du concours "éducation", pour préparer une affiche à l'intention des écoles francophones. Le résultat de ce projet, dirigé par Julie-Parna-Stief et réalisé par Paul Savoie, est une belle affiche qui décrit les réussites d'un certain nombre de nos diplômé(e)s francophones.

The College received a grant of \$315,000 from the transition grant fund. The grant will enable us to purchase the equipment necessary to exchange courses in French at a distance, thereby enabling us to offer a greater variety of courses and add some enrolments to our smallest classes. We will be able to create an audio-visual room, to plan for exchanges and to implement curricular development in Women's Studies.

Grâce à une planification budgétaire très sévère, nous avons pu épargner assez de fonds pour faire l'acquisition d'un laboratoire informatisé. Un comité formé par les départements de français, d'espagnol et d'anglais sera chargé de recommander l'équipement nécessaire.

The Glendon Gallery was moved into the room formerly occupied by the Maison de la Culture. The Gallery was made into a classroom to be known as the McQueen Room/ Salle McQueen.

The books sold at Glendon's store should therefore be the same price as at other Toronto stores. However, students and faculty found this hard to believe.

Roseann Runte also shared her dissatisfaction with the store. Runte stated that the bookstore's specialty orders take far longer than any other store and that Glendon faculty put books on consignment and never receive their revenue from sales. Dr. Runte also discussed the idea of mov-

Several new professors were hired. Dr. Rosienski-Pellerin joined the French Department. Dr. Evelyne Corcos in Psychology and Dr. Bettina Bradbury in History were each appointed for one year.

A study of the Day Care facility indicated that there was insufficient demand to continue the service. A list of daycares with spaces in the area is being prepared and will be available in the Dean of Students's Office.

GFSC Chair Report 1991/1992

During the past year, the Glendon Food Service Committee has been working hard to improve food quality service, variety, and reduce prices. We are pleased to say our efforts produced many positive results.

During October, cafeteria manager Lou Salem added new faces to his staff in the cafeteria and the Bistro. Rudy Ousman joined Lou Salem as assistant manager. Gholm Farahanai, host, and George Chrisstou, chef, could both be found in the Bistro. Their experience has helped improve food and service quality in both areas.

L'Arcade once again this past year was very popular with students. Resident stu-

dents used it to stock up on nightly snacks while day students liked to grab their coffee there before class. Many additions were made, including a magazine rack and a cappuccino maker. Some complaints about L'Arcade this past year were concerning the prices of the products. Numerous students wanted to know for example, why a box of "Tide" was triple the price it was at a grocery store. It was explained that L'Arcade was there for the convenience of the students and supplies were not bought in the same quantity as in a larger grocery store. Hopefully, this is one area which next year's committee can work on to find a solution.

Many additions were made to the cafeteria. A new

frozen Yoghurt machine proved to be popular with all students. The flavoured coffees were also appreciated by many. Curly fries and poutine became new favourites at the grill. Glassware and silverware went missing in great amounts during the year, so Lou brought back paper cups for water and plastic silverware. This slowed down the loss of dishes.

Throughout the year there were talks of moving the Bistro to the Bookstore's location and vice versa. Nothing ever came of the negotiations but the idea is still being discussed.

The GFSC designed a survey for all food services at Glendon, to see which areas the committee's and Restauronics' attention need

to be focused. The surveys were distributed and collected in early April. We decided on a personal approach for distribution and each floor rep handed out the survey and collected it, in hope of further input. The survey results have yet to be tallied.

In early April, the 1992/1993 price list was achieved after two negotiation meetings between Restauronics and the GFSC. The overall total actually decreased by 1.1%. There is however a change. Steam table meals will be served without a starch or a vegetable which will be served which will cost an extra \$0.50 to \$0.70 with the entree. If bought separately from the entree, the starch or vegetable will cost \$0.90.

There will be a \$0.10 discount on all entrees and salads if purchased in a mess kit. More additions to the menu will be made in the new school year.

The efforts of all the members of the Glendon's food team, the GFSC house representative, Leon Wasser, Rudy Ousman, Gholm Farahani and Lou Salem, have all contributed to the full stomachs and happy faces of Glendon's students and Faculty. We should be pleased with our progress during the year. I would personally like to thank all those people who dedicated a portion of their time to help make a voice for all students at Glendon.

JOBS FOR GLENDON STUDENTS

A student from Laval University who is now studying at the University of Western Ontario was hired by the student programmes office for a three week period this summer. 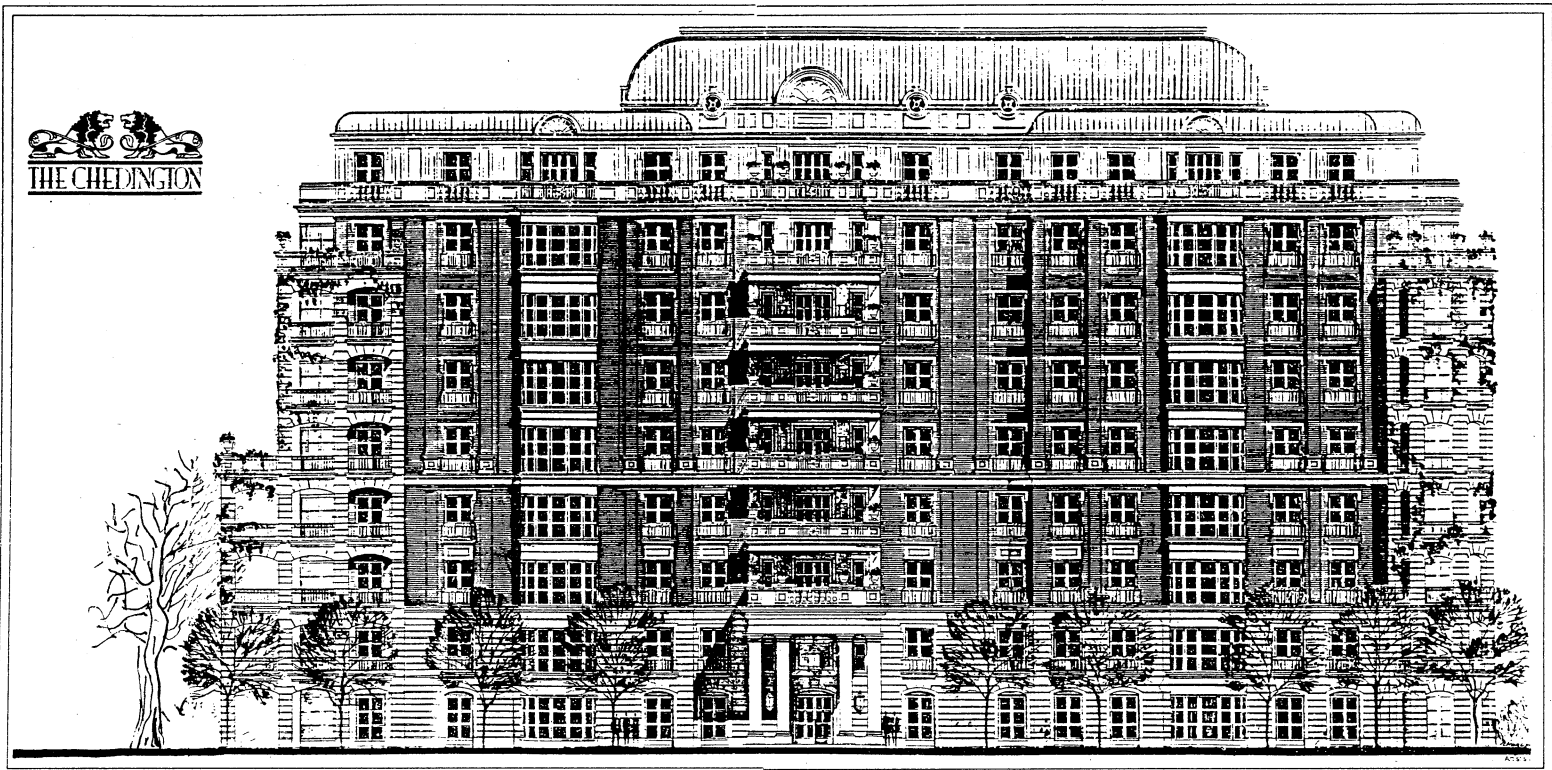

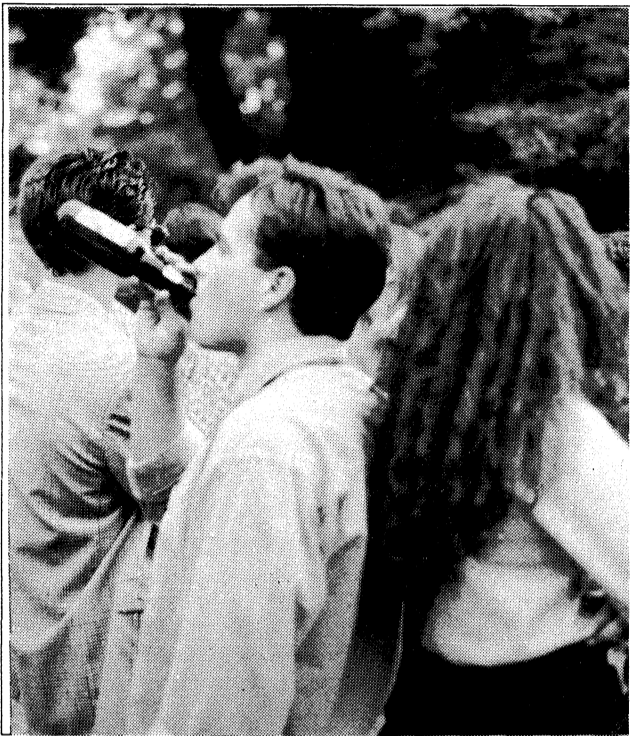

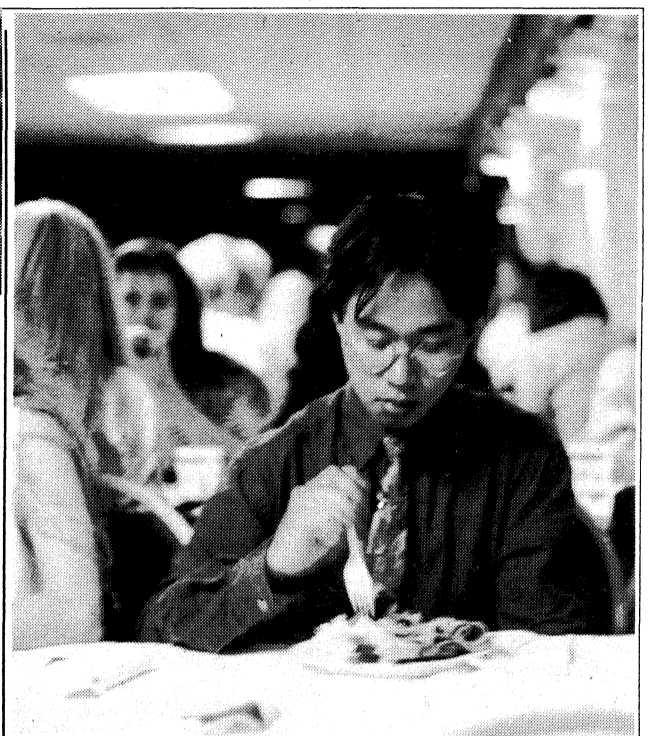

BOOK REVIEW: THE VAN

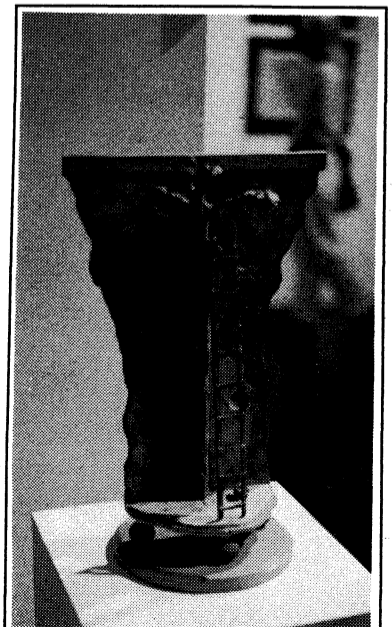

Following the success of The Commitments (which was made into a widely popular movie) and The Snapper, Roddy Doyle's The Van completes the Barrytown trilogy about the Rabbite family. This third novel immerses the reader once again in the fictional North Dublin suburb of Barrytown but this time takes a more intimate look into the character of Jimmy Rabbite Senior. Although rife with Doyle's trademark

humour and wit underlying The Van is the theme of universal pettiness and greed and the sombre reality of unemployment in modern day Dublin.

When Jimmy Rabbite senior joins his close friend in setting up a fish and chips truck, the long-time friendship between the two men slowly deteriorates in a series of hilarious events. From the description of the atmosphere in a local pub on the night of the World Soccer Cup where Ireland plays against England to the

description of Jimmy Rabbite and son Darren cavorting to Hippy Hippy Shake and practising a juggling routine involving ketchup; mustard bottles, The Van is filled with the colourful dialogue of working class North Dubliners. Despite the decisively Irish humour in the novel, Jimmy Rabbite Sr. is portrayed as a refreshing real character who suffers from loneliness, insecurity, meanness of spirit and guilt. In this respect The Van is an insightful yet interesting read.

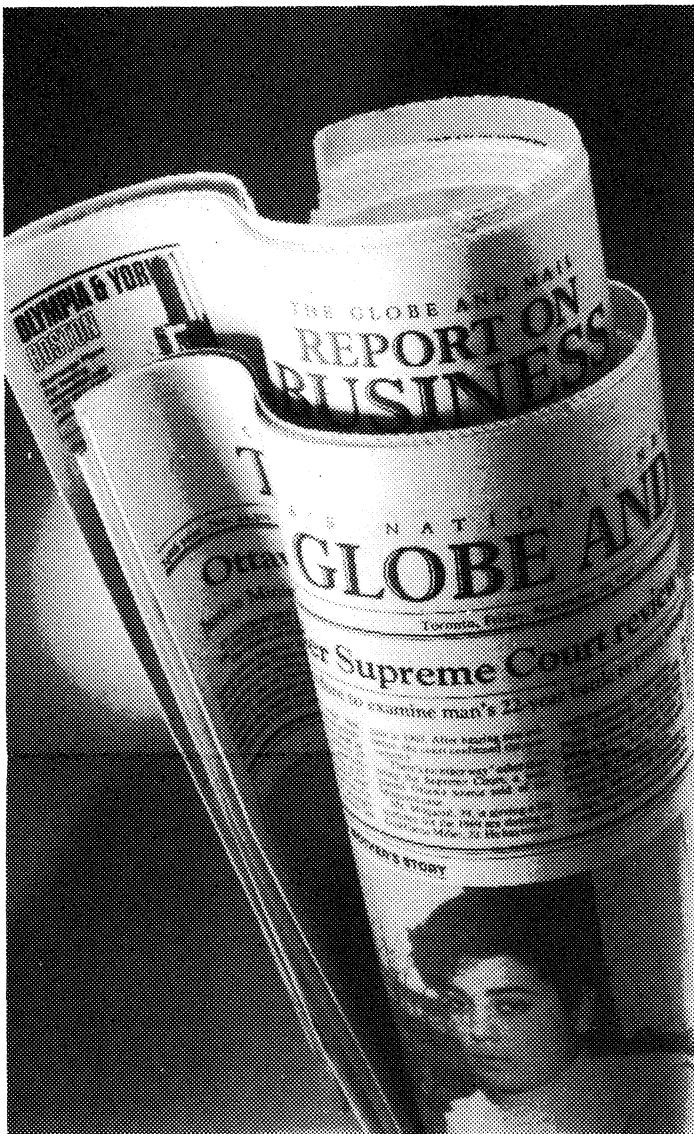

The Montreal Expos have flirted with the three ingredients before but somehow lost it near the end. This year, the Expos are going for the gold and no one will stand in their way.
